## House-Passed Currency Bill Reintroduced

WASHINGTON, DC – U.S. Senators Sherrod Brown (D-OH) and Olympia Snowe (R-ME) and U.S. Representatives Sander Levin (D-MI), Tim Murphy (R-PA), and Tim Ryan (D-OH) today introduced the Currency Reform for Fair Trade Act of 2011. Including Congressmen Levin, Murphy, and Ryan, the House bill was introduced with 101 original sponsors (27 R, 74 D).

The companion bills would make prolonged currency undervaluation actionable under U.S. countervailing duty (CVD) law. Their text is virtually identical to H.R. 2378, the Currency Reform for Fair Trade Act of 2009, bipartisan legislation that was passed by the U.S. House of Representatives by 348 to 79 vote in the 111<sup>th</sup> Congress.

“The Fair Currency Coalition will push for immediate action on this pro-jobs legislation. We support the Currency Reform for Fair Trade Act and other similar bills addressing the China currency issue which may be introduced in the near future,” said Fair Currency Coalition (FCC) Executive Director Charles Blum.

“We are confident that the new Congress will finish what the previous Congress started,” Blum continued.

“The FCC’s grassroots have never stopped pressing the currency issue in e-mails, letters, and town hall meetings. Until Congress acts, foreign countries will continue to cheat and illegally undervalue their currencies to steal American jobs,” Blum emphasized.

“Action speaks louder than words. China clearly has no intention of reversing its illegal currency undervaluation anytime soon. That’s why Congress must enact currency legislation now. Every day of delay means more American jobs lost and more new job creation denied,” Blum finished.

The need for legislation has never been more acute. Illegally undervalued foreign currencies like China’s renminbi (RMB) are unfair export subsidies and trade barriers that discourage new investment needed in America. This lack of investment is evidenced in the snail’s pace recovery of the jobs lost in the last recession, as the United States added an average of only 82,000 jobs per month in 2010, far less than the estimated 150,000 per month needed just to keep pace with new entrants into the U.S. workforce.

China’s prolonged illegal currency undervaluation also aggravates a persistently large trade deficit that destroys middle-class jobs and plunges America ever deeper into foreign indebtedness. The

U.S. bilateral deficit with China for the second half of 2010 is on pace to be the largest ever recorded by the United States for a six-month period.

Since the end of last September when the U.S. House of Representatives passed its bipartisan currency bill, China's foreign currency reserves have grown by an estimated \$200 billion and now total a staggering \$2.9 trillion by the most conservative measures. Moreover, in nominal terms, the RMB has barely increased in value compared to the dollar, rising by just 4 percent, since June 21, 2010.

Despite the continuous engagement and best good-faith efforts of the current and previous administrations, bilateral and multilateral diplomatic talks show no sign of resolving issue satisfactorily. Chinese President Hu Jintao ignored every entreaty to meaningfully address the issue during his January state visit to Washington. The position of his government was no change from years of stonewalling in talks at both the G-20 and the bilateral U.S.-China Strategic and Economic Dialogue.

The FCC is an alliance of business, agriculture, and labor interests that supports passage of legislation to make prolonged foreign currency undervaluation actionable under U.S. countervailing duty law.

## **Backgrounder on Currency Reform for Fair Trade Act**

Introduced by U.S. Senators Sherrod Brown (D-OH) and Olympia Snowe (R-ME) and U.S. Representatives Sander Levin (D-MI), Tim Murphy (R-PA), and Tim Ryan (D-OH), the Currency Reform for Fair Trade Act is virtually identical to legislation (H.R. 2378) that passed the House in the 111<sup>th</sup> Congress by a 348 to 79 vote on September 29, 2010.

The Fair Currency Coalition (FCC)-endorsed Currency Reform for Fair Trade Act:

- Is WTO-compliant and gives no grounds for retaliation by any trading partner;
- Clarifies the responsibility of the Commerce Dept. to investigate alleged currency undervaluation as a prohibited export subsidy and establish the facts on a case-by-case basis;
- Contains a countervailing duty remedy to deter illegal currency undervaluation;
- Orders the Comptroller General of the United States to report on the legislation's implementation nine months following enactment; and
- Specifies applicability to Canada and Mexico of change to U.S. countervailing duty law as required under the North American Free Trade Agreement (NAFTA) implementing legislation – note that this is the only substantive change to the bill that was passed last year.

By enacting the Currency Reform for Fair Trade Act, the Congress would:

- Boost exports and create jobs in the United States;
- Encourage more research and development and investment in new plant and equipment in the United States; and
- Stimulate the U.S. economy without incurring any new public debt or budgetary expenditures.
